ARBITRAL AWARD

After hearing the parties on Friday, August 12, 2005, I find the following facts:

- 1. On or about August 28, 2002, Plaintiff Sara Thomas took her van to be washed at Defendant Mrs. Auto Wash, LLC in East Harford, Connecticut.
- 2. Plaintiff Sara Thomas has been taking her van there for a number of years. Plaintiff Sara Thomas had lived in East Hartford for approximately 15 years.
- 3. Defendant Mrs. Auto Wash, LLC usually used two people to towel dry the exterior of her van, but only one person was used on this occasion.

- 4. When the car was dried, Defendant Mrs. Auto Wash, LLC indicated Plaintiff Sara Thomas should re-enter her van and drive it away.
- 5. Plaintiff Sara Thomas walked through a puddle of water, soap and wax to get to her van.
- 6. As Plaintiff Sara Thomas was stepping on the running board to get into her van, her ankle twisted (although she did not fall).
- 7. The running board was slippery because it was damp.
- 8. Defendant Mrs. Auto Wash, LLC did not owe a duty to Plaintiff Sara Thomas to dry her running boards after washing her car.
- 9. I make not finding on why the running boards were damp.
- 10. Plaintiff Sara Thomas should have know, with reasonable inspection, the running boards were damp.

Judgment shall enter in favor of Defendant Mrs. Auto Wash, LLC and against Plaintiff Sara Thomas.
